### Jesus the Refugee

ur daily Journey tells a story that breaks the soul of humanity, like the three-year-old Kurdish boy Alan Kurdi, his lifeless body washed onto the shore after the refugees' inflatable rubber boat capsized, horrified us. Too often, however, the outrage has yielded little action. A year after his son's death, Alan's father told reporters, "Everyone claimed they wanted to do something because of the photo that touched them so much. But what is happening now? People are still dying, and nobody is doing anything about it.

The number of people forcibly displaced from their homes is the highest since World War II. According to the UN Refugee Agency, "An unprecedented 65.5 million people around the world have been forced from their home. Among them are nearly 22.5 million refugees, over half of whom are under the age of 18.

There are also 10 million stateless people who have been denied a nationality and access to basic rights such as education, healthcare, employment and freedom of moment. In addition, 28,300 people a day are forced to flee their homes because of conflict and persecution.

Also, as we grapple with the terrors refugees face, we must consider the fact that Jesus was a refugee.

"After the scholars were gone, God's angel showed up again in Joseph's dream and commanded, 'Get up. Take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt. Stay until further notice. Herod is on the hunt for this child and wants to kill him.' Joseph obeyed. He got up, and took the child and his mother under cover of darkness. They were out of town and well on their way by daylight. They lived in Egypt until Herod's death. This Egyptian exile fulfilled what Hosea preached, 'I called my son out of Egypt.' Herod, when he realized that the scholars had tricked him, flew into a rage. He commanded the murder of every little boy, two years old and under, who lived in Bethlehem and it's surrounding hills. (He determined the age from the information he'd gotten from the scholars.) That's when Jeremiah's sermon was fulfilled: A sound was heard in Ramah, weeping and much lament. Rachel weeping for her children, Rachel refusing all solace, her children gone, dead and buried." (Matthew 2:13-18, MSG)

Dreamers and refugees are now serving our country in the military, risking their lives protecting our freedom. Dreamers and refugees are now serving in fire and police departments around our nation today!

According to US Today, September 17, 2017 reminds us about 900 undocumented immigrants know as "DREAMers" who are currently serving in the United State military, the Pentagon says, which could prove a major challenge for the administration as it tries to wind down an Obama era program that protected those immigrants from deportation.

Those service members—all of whom have healthcare or languages the United States military considers vital—would be forcing "DREAMERS " to leave the military in March 2018.

The military dreamers include doctors, nurses and service members with proficiency in some languages considered to be of strategic important.

Spanish is not one of those languages, but Arabic, Russian, Chinese and Korean. What will Jesus do? Perhaps, the words of our Lord Jesus Christ proclaim this truth:

"I was hungry, and you fed me, I was thirsty, and you gave me drink, I was homeless, and you gave me room, I was shivering, and you gave me clothes, I was sick, and you stopped to visit, I was in prison and you came to me." (Matthew 25:35-36, MSG)

Our task as disciples is to love the broken, the lost and the refugees because we all are made in the image of God.

We are prayerful that all of you will participate in these times of prayer and truly turn Faith United Methodist Church into a House of Prayer during this season of Lent. Please be part of these times of prayer and see how God will open Heaven itself, and pour out His blessings on you and the church.

### Friday Night at the ODovies presents The Shack Eriday, Eebruary 16th ~ 7:00 pm Lellowship Dall

Mackenzie "Mack" Phillips suffered physical and emotional abuse as a child at the hands of his drunken father. He witnessed similar abuse of his mother as well. There is the implication that as a 13-year-old boy he attempted to poison his father with strychnine. Whether he succeeded in

killing the man is not entirely clear, although subsequent events suggest that he did. But as an adult he has a bountiful life with his wife, Nan, and their three children: Kate, Josh and Missy.

Mack's life is shattered, however, when their youngest child Missy disappears during a camping trip while he is saving Kate and Josh during a canoeing accident. The police determine Missy is the victim of a serial killer after finding her torn dress and blood in a vacant cabin. Kate blames herself for Missy's death because of her own reckless behavior in causing the canoe accident in the first place. The tragedy derails Mack's faith and life until the onset of winter when he receives an unstamped, typewritten note in his mailbox. The surrounding snow is devoid of any incriminating tracks. The message is signed "Papa" (which was Nan's nickname for God) and invites him to meet at the cabin.

Thinking this may possibly be an opportunity for meeting and capturing or killing the serial killer, Mack drives himself there and, finding the ruined cabin cold and desolate and empty, is overcome with frustration, rage and an almost irresistible impulse to turn his handgun on himself. But he suddenly encounters a mysterious trio of strangers who invite him to stay at their well-furnished, cozy little house that is situated just down the path and, oddly, in the midst of a beautiful, sunshiny, summertime wilderness.

The trio of strangers gradually reveal their identities. The purpose of their invitation is to first help him to better understand his life as seen from a much broader context or higher perspective. This realization helps free him from an inclination to pass judgment upon himself as well as upon everyone else who crosses his path. It is from that new starting point that he may then continue his long, slow journey into healing for himself and his family and forgiveness for himself as well as for those who have grievously harmed him and his loved ones.
