Whitt's Wisdom

May the peace of Jesus Christ be with you as we anticipate with Joy the coming of Jesus the Savior into the world and our lives this advent season. The greatest news of all is that God loves us, that he came among us as one of us in human flesh!

Luke 2:10 But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all people.

I am asking that we observe church wide a special time of reflection and meditation for each week of advent which can be done individually or as family time. Parents will need to break down the context for age appropriateness. You may choose to pair up with another church member or friends to share the reading over the phone.

The reflection times include a centering prayer, scriptures to touch a wrestling in our souls, probing questions and a prayer to carry throughout the week, and ending with a walking forward in Faith challenge.

You may select the day and time, but I suggest the same day and time each week with a reminder in your phone, for example, Tuesdays December 3, 10, 17, and 24 of Advent at 7:00 pm. Instead of using your phone, a note on the refrigerator, on the closet door, on the mirror, next to the dresser, in the car, or even next to the bowl in the bathroom — the choice is yours. Please remember this special time during advent.

For many of you who have a set morning or evening devotion time, adding a few minutes for Advent reflections will enrich your soul. This church wide practice may be a gentle yet powerful witness in sharing with others what the members of Faith United Methodist Church of Twinsburg have committed to for this advent season. When asked "how are you getting ready for Christmas," reply "my whole church has a special devotion time."

Week One: Born to deliver December 1, 2019

CENTERING PRAYER: Come, Lord Jesus, come. Come into our midst. Come into our hearts. Come into our homes and our community, into our schools and workplaces. May we welcome you everywhere, making room for you, preparing for you, anticipating your arrival with joy and reverence. We commit this season of Advent to becoming ready. Shine your light in those nooks and crannies we keep in the shadows. Sweep the cobwebs from our long-hidden doubt and fear. Repair our torn and wounded places. We long for your arrival. Come, Lord Jesus, come. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 40:1-5

PROBING QUESTION: What is your favorite Christmas memory? Why?

WRESTLING WITH THE WORD: Read Isaiah 40:1-5.

- •This is a common prophecy read during Advent. Why do you believe that is? Why do you believe John the Baptist quotes from Isaiah 40 when he prophecies about Jesus?
- •What speaks to you in this prophecy? What about Jesus' birth brings you comfort? Hope?
- Take time and read the entire chapter. Isaiah 40 is considered a passage on comfort and God's strength. What do you hear in this entire chapter? What is life changing?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK:

Gracious God, we are a people of many distractions, pulled in different directions, responding to multiple and often conflicting needs. We thank you for the gifts of Sabbath and worship, for a space and a time to set aside everything that tugs at us, and instead focus our hearts and minds on you. Draw us more deeply into your presence. Grant us rest as we rely on your provision, and faith as we trust in your grace. Quiet our spirits so we may hear your Spirit speaking to us. Amen.

What would it look like to turn your swords into plowshares? •What does it mean to you if Jesus was to initiate the era of peace? •How does this passage shape your everyday life? How does this passage impact your preparation for Christmas? •What does it mean this Christmas to walk in the path of peace?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK:

Surprising God, your word sets wonder in motion. Like Mary, we are filled with amazement that you have found favor with us and that you choose to be present in the world through us. We join Mary in giving birth to hope, to love, to peace for all creation, in all corners of the world. We praise you for the gift of your Son, whom we follow. Surprising God, bless us again and open us to the wonder of your love flowing in us and through us. Amen.

WALKING FORWARD IN FAITH: •Pray with God over the anger you are carrying. How will you address each anger and walk with Jesus in peace towards Christmas? •Pray over a broken relationship in your life. How can you make peace with this situation? Perhaps with face to face confrontation, write a letter, or write your feelings and burn them. •How will you change your life this Advent?

Week 3 Rejoice! Rejoice! December 15, 2019

CENTERING PRAYER: Holy and mysterious God, you are the creator of the world and everything in it. We come before you to praise and glorify you. We rejoice in the wonders of your creation and all the ways you provide for us and sustain us. Open our hearts and minds to your Word and fill us with your Spirit. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 35

PROBING QUESTION: •What are you most excited about in the next few weeks? •How will you rejoice this Christmas?

WRESTLING WITH THE WORD: Read Isaiah 35. •How do you see the work of the messiah in this chapter? How do you see this in your everyday life? •As you read verse 8, what does it mean for you to live on the highway of holiness? What does that look like each and every day? •Jesus's birth fulfils this passage; however, it is also a passage for today and the future. How do you see this exists right now? Considering this passage, what will that look like to you when Jesus comes again?

WALKING FORWARD IN FAITH •Beyond the gifts, dinner and parties — what does rejoice at Christmas mean to you? How will this year be different from last year? •How will you incorporate Jesus into the next ten days? Have or will you grow your faith from how you celebrated three years ago? •What will rejoice look like today, tomorrow, on Christmas Eve and on Christmas Day? •How will you celebrate this Christmas as Jesus' birthday and not another family party?

PRAYER FOR THE WEEK:

Almighty God, the time of waiting is almost over. Like new parents eagerly awaiting the birth of a child, we impatiently wait with you for the birth of your Son. We stand in awe, knowing what the birth of this particular baby means for our lives, yet are unable to fully comprehend the depth of your love for us. We pray in Jesus' name Holy God, that you receive us into your presence as both gift and miracle, and we thank you. Thank you for sharing the light of your glory (Continued on next page)






downstairs bath and hallway are the major areas to go. We are hoping to have it on the market by the end of the month. Major setbacks to our timeline included the deck having to be completely



Friday Night at the Movies presents

The Nativity Story Friday, December 13th, 7:00 pm in Fellowship Hall



The story begins in the Roman province of Judea with the portrayal of the Massacre of the Innocents in the Nativity. The remainder of the film portrays the annunciation (conception) and birth of Jesus Christ to explain why King Herod the Great ordered the murder. One year before the massacre, Zechariah, a rabbi in Jerusalem, is making an offering, when he is told in a vision by the Archangel Gabriel that his wife, Elizabeth will bear a son. Zechariah does not believe him, stating that he is too old, and Gabriel tells him that he will be unable to speak until the boy is born. In Nazareth, 14-year-old Mary is farming when soldiers come to collect taxes. One man, unable to pay, has a third of his land seized and his daughter pressed into debt slavery. Mary, betrothed to marry 32-year-old Joseph of Judaea, is visited by Archangel Gabriel and told that she will become pregnant with God's son, whom she is to name "Jesus". He tells her that God has blessed her cousin Elizabeth with a child despite her old age. Mary visits her before the harvest, where she witnesses the birth of John the Baptist to Elizabeth and Zechariah, who regains his speech. Mary returns from the visit pregnant, to the shock of Joseph and her parents, who fear that Joseph will accuse her of adultery, a sin punishable by death by stoning according to the Torah. At first Joseph does not believe Mary's religious explanation, but decides not to accuse her. Still shocked and angry, he is later visited in a dream by the Archangel Gabriel, who tells him of God's plan for Mary's son. Finally believing, he is ashamed of his earlier doubts.

Meanwhile, Roman emperor Caesar Augustus has demanded that every man across the Roman Empire return with his family to his place of birth for the census. A direct descendant of King David, Joseph is forced to travel 110 kilometers (68 mi) across Palestine's rocky terrain from Nazareth to Bethlehem, the place of his birth. With Mary on a donkey laden with supplies, it takes the couple nearly four weeks to reach Bethlehem. Upon arriving in town, Mary goes into labor, and Joseph frantically seeks a place for her to deliver. There is, however, no room in any inn or home because of the crowds arriving for the census, but at the last minute an innkeeper offers his stable for shelter.

Meanwhile, three Magi—Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar—travel towards Judaea after having previously discovered that three planets will align to form a great star. This Star of Bethlehem appears before the Magi after a visit by the Archangel Gabriel. The Magi visit Herod and reveal to him that the Messiah is still a child and he will be a Messiah "for the lowest of men to the highest of kings." Shocked by this, Herod asks that they visit the newborn Messiah and report the child's location back to him, under the pretence that he, too, would like to worship him, while in fact he plans to kill the baby for fear of a new king taking his throne. The Magi arrive at the stable where Mary is giving birth to Jesus, and they present the Infant with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Suspicious of his intentions, the Magi avoid Herod, returning home via a different route. Herod realises that the Magi have tricked him and orders the death of every boy in Bethlehem under the age of two. Joseph is warned in a dream of the danger and flees to Egypt with Mary and Jesus as the film ends.

Embracing Shared Ministry: Our Fund Drive this December

Have you ever wondered, "Where do churches go when they need help?" The answer for United Methodist churches is the North Coast District and the East Ohio Conference. The District and Conference are helping us right now:

- Instead of borrowing money from our members to make the updates to the parsonage, our District has loaned it to us interest free asking us to simply repay it at the time of sale.
- Instead of creating a hardship for us during our housing transition, our conference has given us money to help pay Rev. Whitt's housing allowance through the end of this year.
- Instead of telling us we are "on our own" when it comes to creating safe sanctuaries, the conference has provided a service for background checks for our leadership that works with children.
- Instead of asking us to retain a lawyer for legal questions, our conference has legal services available.
- When the city required us to connect to the city sewer and when we had roof damage, our conference helped us out.

These items are specific for Faith United Methodist Church of Twinsburg. Our conference does much more than this as it supports missions beyond East Ohio. One example is in Autaze, Brazil, along a tributary of the Amazon River, where a volunteer United Methodist medical team went by boat to offer a free medical clinic. The funds that we contributed for Shared Ministries helped The United Methodist on Relief committed to invest over \$20 million in aid and recovery in Puerto Rico since 2017.

We are being supported by our conference and it is our turn to support it. Last year, we contributed \$5000 dollars toward our shared ministry goal. This year, our conference gave that, and more, back to us. This year, we would like to give the amount we gave last year, but we do not have it as our expenses have been more than our income. Can you prayerfully consider donating to Shared Ministry this December? We will have special envelopes marked "Year-End Special Giving "beginning December 8, 2019, or note the same on your check.

As a church, we have been running in the red, but we know that God is in control. We are praying for this \$5000 and more. Any money over the \$5000 that is donated will be placed in the general fund to help put us back in the black.
