

# The Woo Factor

Sports Illustrated tells the story of an active kindergartener who attempted to stand at the edge of his family bath tub. On wash day the tin basin would be full of water. On this day it was empty, so he plays with it for no reason at all because he wanted to. The tub flipped up and smashed him in the face, leaving him with a scar under his left eye and a nickname... *Tub*.

Tub and his family lived in a three-room house. Fifteen residents in a three-room home. Number 556 14th Street didn't have hot water, but it had a chicken coop out back. Delois Ramey and Aunt Cardia, two sisters helping each other with their children—every night was the Woo Factor.

Sometimes the meals were a miracle and other times it was only corn bread. The girls would eat first and the boys last.

The rules at 556 14th Street were simple:
If it's not yours, don't take it.
If it's not nice, don't say it.
If you know it's not right, don't do it.

He witnessed his mother and Aunt work tirelessly to put food on the table, getting 13 children ready for school and ready for church, and Sunday was not easy but God provided. Still, some years on Christmas no presents appeared.

Tub was amazed, but God provided. He would rake yards and cut grass to bring most of his money home. He also got a job at his uncle's *Phillips 66* station pumping gas and cleaning windshields in downtown Batesville, Arkansas.

God blessed the family of fifteen with faith in God plus hard work. Life at 556 14th Street improved because everyone in the family was working and going to school. They were blessed with more food on the table. Tub and his brother Eddie felt rich and highly favored.

Tub went to college and his coach, Coach Carpenter helped Tub get a job as a graduate assistant at the University of Florida. It was the first time he traveled outside Arkansas. The rest is history. Tub is the nickname for Charlie Strong, head football coach at the University of South Florida.

Charlie Strong's life is a miracle story. The Woo Factor because of the strong family witness to the power of God moving in their lives and making a way out of no way.

Matthew 14: 15-21 (MSG) is a Woo Factor story:

Toward evening the disciples approached him. "We're out in the country and it's getting late. Dismiss the people so they can go to the villages and get some supper." But Jesus said, "There is no need to dismiss them. You give them supper." "All we have is five loaves of bread and two fish," they said. Jesus said, "Bring them here." Then he had the people sit on the grass. He took the five loaves and two fish, lifted his face to heaven in prayer, blessed, broke, and gave the bread to his disciples. The disciples then gave the food to the congregation. They all ate their fill. They gathered twelve baskets of leftovers. About five thousand were fed.

In America today 49 million Americans struggle to put food on the tables.

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization estimates that about 815 million people of 7.6 billion people in the world, or one in ten, were suffering from chronic undernourishment in 2016.

Worldwide, 1 billion people, or just under 15% of the world's population, live on the equivalent of less than \$1.25 a day.

Dr. Justo Gonzalez, a Cuban Methodist theologian tells us: "When a hungry child reads the text in Africa or Mexico, it is different from a child in the West. If you never experience hunger, your belief in miracles is laughable. However, if you experience the pain of eating corn bread for supper, the stories of two little fish and five loaves of bread is a source of hope. Perhaps, the story itself can woo you to believe there is a better tomorrow like it was for (Tub) Charlie Strong.

Birthdays are about family. Come and celebrate October's birthdays with your church family. We will celebrate in the middle of the month on October 21st after second service.



# Presence - God's Not Dead 3 - A Light in the Darkness

After Rev. David Hill is released from prison, controversy is sparked against Dave's St. James Church, which is on college campus grounds. This causes the college to start the process of shutting down the church, much to the dismay of Dave and his partner Jude. When informed of the decision to shut down the church and to replace it with a building to expand the school, Dave and Jude begin the process of suing the college to save St. James. Things get worse when



college student Adam Richertson, in protest, tosses a brick into the church, igniting a fire that kills Jude and nearly destroys the church. Dave is forced to come to grips with the loss of these events. Adam is horrified by his actions and contemplates whether to confess to the crime, leading him to reconnect with his skeptical girlfriend, Keaton.

During the lawsuit against the church, Dave seeks the help of his estranged brother, attorney Pearce Hill, who tries to explain to Dave that it is not a case worth fighting for. Dave refuses to listen to his brother's advice and continues the case into court. After failing to reach a settlement with the college, the trial date is set for the lawsuit. At the same time, Adam sends an anonymous text to Dave, confessing to the church fire, causing a furious Dave to assault him when confronting him. This severely wounds his lawsuit's case and leads to Adam being arrested.

After seeking God's help in church through prayer, Dave eventually realizes that his case has only made things worse and that St. James is not the right church for God and his followers. He drops his lawsuit, reaches an out-of-court settlement with the college, and after talking with a repentant Adam and consulting with Jude's family, ultimately asks to have the criminal charges against Adam dropped. He then announces to his college protesters that while St. James will be torn down, he will reopen a new church not far from the school for future followers.
