IN HUMBLE SUBMISSION I AM SHARING THE PASTOR'S REPORT AND GOAL SETTING REPORT FOR THE CHARGE CONFERENCE ON NOVEMBER 9, 2019. WITH YOU

I know that it is with great joy that I have the pleasure of serving as your Pastor since July 1, 2019. I have been in Sunday worship with you for a total of 18 Sundays! In some sense, time flies as we grow together in our commitment to Christ.

In reflecting what is presently most important at Twinsburg Faith as new and future goals, I realize it's a challenge as we are in the middle of a visioning plan. I look forward to that progress evolving over the next few months. Nevertheless, I will share some initial assessment and possible goals for your consideration.

What I share with you now are some initial steps that will be refined over time as we search the leading of the Lord in the life of Twinsburg Faith United Methodist Church.

I am extremely proud of the faithfulness of the lay leadership of Twinsburg Faith. The current leadership responded to critical issues in the church and is the key to many meaningful and lasting church life experiences.

I am also proud of where we are as a church and the strength and the growing edges for the five areas of church life. They include worship, community outreach, evangelistic focus, discipleship, and Christian fellowship. At the same time, within our church life there is room for growth and strength.

The worship experience of having a great variety between the two services is a strength as we are serving two distinct styles of worship. Each one has attracted visitors that have returned after a positive worship experience! A strength of the services is tremendous lay leadership, for which I am most grateful.

You have welcomed my suggestions and recommendations to improve the flow of our worship as we continue open communications. The core group during the first service is composed of a group of extremely dedicated persons. Without a doubt, the members of the core group are a great asset for the first service as is the Praise Band during the second service.

One of our challenges is the flow of both services. The Praise Band along with the musical program in the second service will need support and prayers. Both services can be improved as we seek open unpredictable-predictable structures, a balance between increased professionalism and inviting members of the congregation to take part in the service, and ways to allow the deep expressions of spiritual gifts. We are also challenged to upgrade the worship experience by working with the outside commitments of the leadership, physical space, freedom of movement and limited time restraints.

The commitment for community outreach (service and justice) remains a strong focus for Twinsburg members when asked, but the substance has been lacking for more than a few years. During the last few years Twinsburg has made monetary gifts to a local and international mission but almost no hands-on missions for the entire congregation. The new monthly community meal in concert with other Twinsburg churches is an ecumenical step forward. Combining the meal with opening the G.I.F.T. Shop was a spiritually lead endeavor in the right direction, and I am proud of the quick progress in the number of volunteers that have stepped forward.

The exact nature of a future outreach program remains to be developed especially since we are located in

a mixed socioeconomic community. Any outreach would have to be very focused to be successful over time. I am extremely excited about the REACH cohort that will enhance our community presence.

As I have become increasingly familiar with members of Twinsburg Faith, I am aware of its unique approach to evangelistic focus which has proved to be a place of growth for many of its members. There are a number of persons who have in their work and personal life shared their faith as a form of evangelistic focus, and no doubt these persons have positively impacted others.

It remains before us to develop a church-wide method to encourage persons to share their faith. A starting point may be three basic steps: We must identify our mission field. Next, we will need to focus on the message of the Gospel. Then move forward to the third step, which is sharing our true life stories of God's power. As a church community, it is a joy in knowing that no matter how "ordinary" our lives may appear, we as the people of God, in this location, have stories to tell.

There are many members and friends at Twinsburg Faith who desire to be in a position for discipleship growth. For a good number of folks, the Bible studies and outside spiritual growth experiences have strengthened their relationship with God. At the same time, discipleship has been minimum at the local church level. A discipleship program using the leadership within the church would be an excellent starting place. I would suggest using the resources of the United Methodist System. One direction is to develop small groups dealing with the intertwining of relationship between contemporary issues with spiritual growth.

Christian Fellowship has been a strong point with Twinsburg Faith over a number of years. The coffee hour after the 9:00 a.m. service and the luncheons after the 11:00 a.m. service have served a number of people in a loving and lasting manner along with the Sunday Community meals. The goal is to expand the number of people supporting this aspect of church life by moving toward a greater diversity of style, needs, content, and people attending.

As we look at these five church life pillars, we praise God for where we are as we strive to make improvements. Yet we rest in the hands of God who, through the Holy Spirit, is moving us to accept the challenges that we will face in the coming year of 2020.

Before us remains the opportunities to be the best we can be in serving Christ under the circumstances that we face at Twinsburg Faith United Methodist Church, over against facing possible major changes in 2020 regarding the structure of the United Methodist Church.

Let us remember the words my daughter shared with me this week.

Grapes must be crushed to make wine

Diamonds form under pressure.

Olives are pressed to release oil.

Seeds grow in darkness.

Whenever you feel crushed, under pressure, pressed, or in darkness, you're in a powerful place of transformation and transmutation. Trust the process, Trust God. Amen.

With God all things are possible. Jesus looked at them and said, "With man this is impossible, but not with God; all things are possible (Mark 10:27).

It is hard enough to make one Christian, harder still to make a Christian church. To make a Christian nation is a task to stagger the imagination; to make a Christian world may well seem all but impossible. Yet this, no less, is the goal to which our religion sets us.




December. We will meet from **1pm to 3pm**. If you can't make it and are looking for something special (ie: Luv's diapers) just let us know. We take requests.


